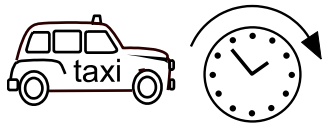

on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> June 2010 at the Council House.**

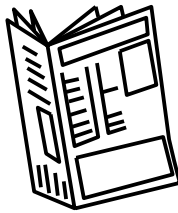


The taxis were late, so the meeting started without some people.

## **Changes in Day and residential Services – Paul Haigh and Lesley Saxton**



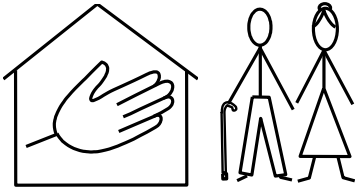
Lesley has sent a newsletter to people about changes to day services. Paul Haigh talked about the changes.

Evergreen drama group has moved to a room at Springwood. This is better and will save money.



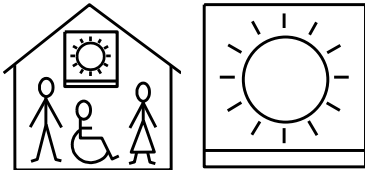
Aspley Wood School is being turned into a new day centre.



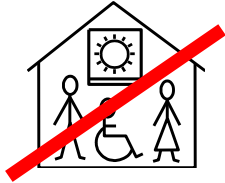
Bestwood will be closing and some people will go to the new day service when it is ready next year.

West Area Project is probably going to close.

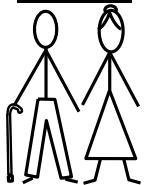
## **Health Needs Assessment – Iain Little**

Bad Things:

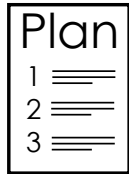
- People with learning disabilities are not as likely to have checks for things like cancer.

- People with learning disabilities might have shorter lives.

- There are new services like the Hospital Liaison Team and Health Facilitators.
- More people are getting an annual health check.



The report will help people write plans.

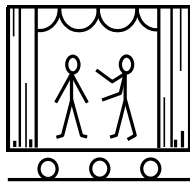


The Health Facilitators are working with people from Springwood.

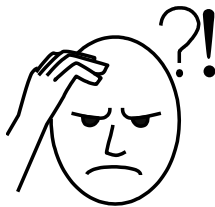
## Talkback



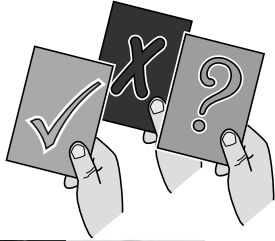
Wayne, Roger and Terry went to the Big Health Day.



It was a good day. The advocacy group did a performance.



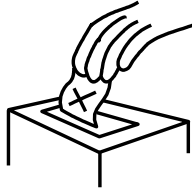
Some things were confusing. Some of the questions were hard.



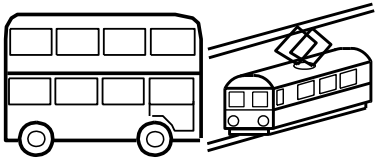
The way people had to vote was hard to understand.



Scott and Terry went to the Regional Forum Meeting.

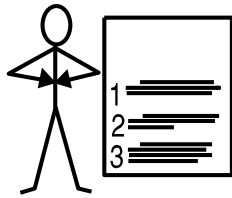


They voted for a new East Midlands representative to the National Forum. Craig from Northampton won.



The meeting talked about transport.

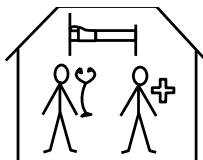
## **Person Centred Planning – Mark Bull & Mickey Arnold**



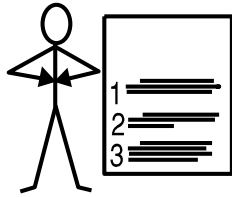
Mark Bull and Mickey Arnold gave a talk about Person Centred Planning.



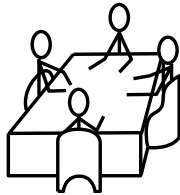
The PCP team is working with people at Bestwood about the changes at the Day Centre.

There is a group called the Person Centred Approaches Group. It helps people find out more about PCP.

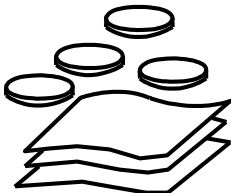


Cat Eglington was one of the people that went to Bosnia last year to visit a group called Sumero. Next year a group of people from Sumero will be coming to Nottingham.

## **Carers' Corner**

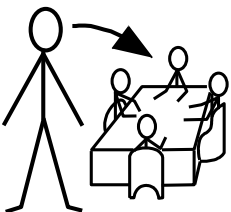


John asked about the meeting notes. The meeting notes were not on the website. Jim Broughton apologised and said he would make sure they were put on.



Trevor asked about ways to help people who were not claiming benefits they were allowed to have.

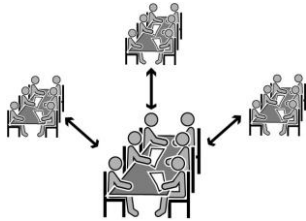
## **Changing the Partnership Board – Sharon Bramwell**

## Getting A Life – Justin Hammond

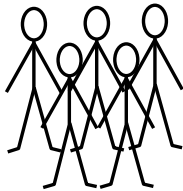


*Getting A Life*

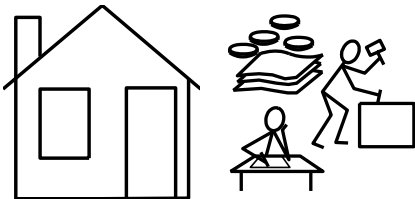
Justin Hammond came to talk about the “Getting a Life” project.

It will look at important things like housing and jobs.



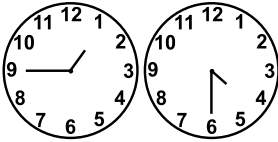
